



SKI-HI Training

About

The Sensory Kids Impaired Home Intervention (SKI-HI) curriculum is a comprehensive approach to family-centered home intervention for families of infants and young children who are identified as deaf or hard of hearing (DHH). SKI-HI programming helps families learn how to promote language and communication in a way that best matches the child's needs, which could include the use of Auditory-Oral, Visual/Sign Communication, and American Sign Language (ASL)/English Bilingualism. Professionals who support families through early intervention are encouraged to receive training to implement the SKI-HI curriculum and use the Language Development Scales as an assessment tool for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers (ages birth to 5).

This workshop is for school personnel who provide early intervention services for families of children in Michigan who are DHH, as well as students enrolled in the DHH Consortium for Teacher Preparation.

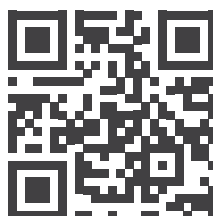
