About Cane Quest

At this event, students will be challenged to demonstrate fundamental orientation and mobility (O&M) skills and travel techniques for navigating the sighted world they live in. Cane Quest® is a challenging O&M contest for students, created and organized by Braille Institute of America. Regional Cane Quest® events are held across the country, and contestants are divided into three grade categories: Scouts, Explorers, and Trailblazers. This event is for students who receive O&M training, use a cane, and are in grades 3-12.

Participants will:

- get direct feedback on their O&M skills
- interact with other students and mentors who are cane users
- gain information about O&M skills and training

This event is a collaboration between Leader Dogs for the Blind and the Michigan Department of Education - Low Incidence Outreach.

Audience:

This event is for students in grades 3-12 who are Visually Impaired, have received instruction in using a white cane, and are cognitively and physically able to walk independently for an hour at a time.

Each student's visual acuity must fall within the B1 through B2 classification range, as defined by the United States Association of Blind Athletes. For more information about eligibility requirements, visit bit.ly/Fall22CaneQuest.
