Participants will learn about the latest updates to JAWS and how to use it to access Microsoft Word 2016/2019 effectively. - Create, edit, and save documents with JAWS commands
- Navigate the ribbon toolbar, File tab, and Backstage View
- Customize and access items on the Quick Access Toolbar
- Use navigational keys to format documents and access tables
- Use Access Keys to activate features on the ribbon and Quick Access Toolbar
