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Five Minute ILS Activities

- Put on lotion/hand sanitizer
- Read/compare a variety of menus
- Read a variety of different maps (school/community buildings, city/state, parks etc)
- Use CCTV or handheld magnifier to look at a variety of coupons (talk about what used for, where you can use it, etc.)
- Make chocolate milk
- Make microwave popcorn
- Make microwave pretzel
- Use toaster to make toast, pop tart, bagel, etc.
- Read utility bill (date due, amount owed, address to send it to, etc.
- Open bag of pretzels, chips, etc.
- Sort/name/count money
- Learn folding techniques for money
- Count specified amount of money and use vending machine
- Fold washcloths/hand towels/bath towels
- Practice putting on gloves/mittens
- Use key to open door lock
- Open/close a variety of doors
- Peel orange/banana
- Frost a cupcake or cookie
- Make hot chocolate
- Compare different kinds of grapes, apples, vegetables, etc.
- Tax or no tax (what items are taxed and what items are not)

- File/paint fingernails
- Tell me what you are wearing ("I am wearing," "your friend is wearing")
- How much does it cost? Bring in advertisements and have students guess how much things cost
- Get a drink of water from a water fountain
- Put a straw in a juice box and drink it
- Clip/unclip a chip bag
- Open/close a variety of different containers
- Use CCTV or magnifier to read
 medicine bottle
- Open applesauce or pudding cup and use spoon to eat
- Tie shoes
- Put items in a snack bag and close it
- Put items in/take out of backpack
- Take lid off/put lid on game
- Get game pieces out/put away
- Make a sandwich, cut in half, and put in sandwich bag
- Get out wipe and wash face/hands
- Get out cleaning wipe and wipe off table
- Put pillow in pillowcase
- Fold shirts/pants
- Put clothes on hangers
- Change batteries in a game and play it
- Sweep floor
- Vacuum floor
- Answer the phone



- Make a phone call/leave a message
- Write a thank you letter, put it in an envelope, address it, and put a stamp on it
- Staple or put paperclips on a stack of papers
- Wrap a gift
- Take money out of a coin purse and put it in a piggy bank
- Open a key or combination lock
- Open/drink a single-serving milk
- Wash/dry dishes
- Spread butter and jelly on crackers
- Use paper towel/napkin to wipe mouth and hands
- Pull paper towel off roll or napkin out of napkin dispenser
- Pull tissue out of box and wipe/blow
 nose
- Carry tray to the sink or trash can
- Practice personal information (phone number and address)
- Loop a belt through belt loops
- Lace shoes
- Tie a necktie
- Put on a Band-Aid
- Buy something out of a vending machine
- Set a simple table setting
- Use condiments from a variety of containers
- Use a can opener
- Write out a shopping list
- Talk about what stores sell items on your shopping list
- Water plants
- Sort items for recycling

- Use a broom and a dust pan
- Use simple household tools to fix something
- Clean your glasses
- Identify clothes that are inside out
- Match socks
- Sort silverware
- Clean/organize contents of locker or bag
- Find exits in the building
- Discuss what to do in emergencies (fire, tornado)
- Learn parent's full name and what kind of car they drive
- Exposure to several different kinds of phones
