

Using Word Documents with JAWS and Brailiant

Common commands for using Word documents with the JAWS screen reader and Brailiant:

- Dot 4 with space bar: Move the focus down one line and read it aloud.
- Dot 1 with space bar: Move the focus up one line and read it aloud.
- Dot 6 with space bar: Move the cursor to the next character and read it aloud.
- Dot 3 with space bar: Move the cursor to the prior character and read it aloud.
- Command key 5 on braille display: Move the cursor to the next word and read it aloud.
- Command key 2 on braille display: Move the cursor to the previous word and read it aloud.
- M with space bar: Move the focus to the menu bar for editing/navigation.
- Dots 4:6 with space bar: Activate the tab key when typing.
- Dots 1-2-3 with space bar: Move the focus to the beginning of the document.
- Dots 4-5-6 with space bar: Move the focus to the end of the document.
