

Inputting Addresses and Traveling to an Address

Materials: Victor Reader Trek GPS

Talking points for inputting addresses:

- Review key describer mode, letters and numbers
- Landmarks vs. addresses

GOALS:

Campers will independently demonstrate all the tasks below using the Victor Reader Trek GPS by the end of the lesson.

Task	Task
Select the correct map	Pedestrian mode vs. Motorized mode
Have address ready (civic #, street name & city)	How GPS views addresses, accuracy, combination of GPS and O&M skills
Select the desired letter or number	How to find the next instruction?
Delete an incorrect letter or number	Rerouting & problem solving
Input 3 to 4 letters of City and Street name before pressing confirm to hear options	Ending the route

ENTERING AN ADDRESS:

Number/Letter	Number/Letter	Number/Letter
1	2 ABC	3 DEF
4 GHI	5 JKL	6 MNO
7 PQRS	8 TUV	9 WXYZ

NOTE: In the event you make a mistake or lose your place when entering information, use the following keys to get back on track:

Left Arrow (4) key: tap for backspace

Repeat key: tap to have the information you just entered spelled back to you

Explore (*) key: tap to return to the previous level of entry i.e. from street name to city name

Information key: tap to hear where you are and the information you have already provided

Explore (*) key: tap several times to escape the route creation process.
