Camp Tuhsmeheeta

Camp Tuhsmeheeta (Camp T) was established in 1974 by Robert H. Thompson, a former superintendent of the Michigan School for the Blind. The camp was designed for students who are Blind/Low Vision (BLV). The name includes the four senses of touch (tuh), smell (sme), hearing (he), and taste (ta).

The camp is located on over 300 pristine acres of forest along the Morgan Mills chain of lakes west of Greenville, Michigan. Today, Camp T is an extension of the Michigan Department of Education Resource for Blind/Low Vision and Deaf/Hard of Hearing (MDE RBLVDHH).

Camp T provides outdoor education and recreation programs with a focus on students in Michigan who are BLV or who are DHH.

Youth Education Groups

Camp T is also available for Michigan groups with an educational focus for school-age children. Youth education groups reserving camp must provide:

- programming
- adequate staff
- proof of liability insurance
- a licensed lifeguard
- supplies for arts and crafts
- accommodation requests

Tenting

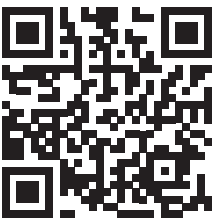
