The LEAD-K MI Legislation on Assessments

The department shall adopt existing tools or assessments to be used by local school districts, intermediate school districts, public school academies, and the Michigan School for the Deaf to assess the language and literacy development of a child who is deaf or hard of hearing and is age 5 or younger.

Legislation, cont.

The tools or assessments must

- Show stages of language development
- Track development of expressive and receptive language acquisition and developmental stages toward English literacy
- Already exist as instruments or assessments for DHH children

Legislation, cont.

- Be appropriate in content and administration for DHH children ages 5 and younger
- Track progress and inform establishing or modifying an individualized family service plan or individualized education program
- Be reflective of the recommendations of the advisory committee

Your Role and Responsibilities

By September 1, 2025

- Implement the assessments to track development
- Administer the assessments or any other assessments used to assess development of children with disabilities as required by federal law

Responsibilities, cont.

Based on assessment results, if the child does not meet developmental milestones or demonstrate progress needed to meet milestones, the IFSP or IEP team shall provide to each service plan team member and the parent:

- A written statement explaining in detail why the child is not meeting developmental milestones or progressing toward them
- A written recommendation including specific strategies, services, and programs that must be provided to the child to assist toward becoming linguistically prepared for kindergarten and English literacy










Visual Communication and Sign Language Checklist

Training requirements: ASLPI score of 4 or above, actively working with 0-5 DHH children, M.A. in education or related field



Collecting Language Outcomes Data

Partnership with University of Colorado-Boulder

- Collect, track, and analyze data
- Produce child-level report
- Provide state-level report

Data collection every 6 months is the gold standard.
