 - Current enrollment in course work to complete the DHH endorsement.
 - Completion of course work in the area of DHH.
- In depth experience working with students who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing.
- Understanding of Federal and State of Michigan laws, regulations, and rules in special education.
- Knowledge of DHH resources.
- Proficient in the use of technology.
- Ability to support families and schools using various philosophies, methods and communication options for children who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing.
- Understanding of hearing loss, hearing aid devices, cochlear implants and listening and spoken language philosophy and strategies.
- Ability to use American Sign Language in a fluent manner to communicate with students, staff, and the Deaf community.

- Collaborate with and act as liaison to the Office of Special Education (OSE); Office of Assessment and Accountability (OAA), Division on Deaf, DeafBlind and Hard of Hearing (DODDBHH); Interpreter preparation programs; Teachers and Consultants of DHH; and MDE-LIO Consultants for Blind-Visually Impaired in matters involving DHH.
- Coordinate American Sign Language-Performance Interviews (ASL-PI).
- Collect, review, and analyze data related to DHH needs.

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- Identify additional DHH needs and collaborate with MDE-LIO supervisor.
- Keep MDE-LIO DHH web site information up-to-date.
- Provide/arrange for presentations as needed/requested.
- Serve as a state and national liaison for DHH organizations.
